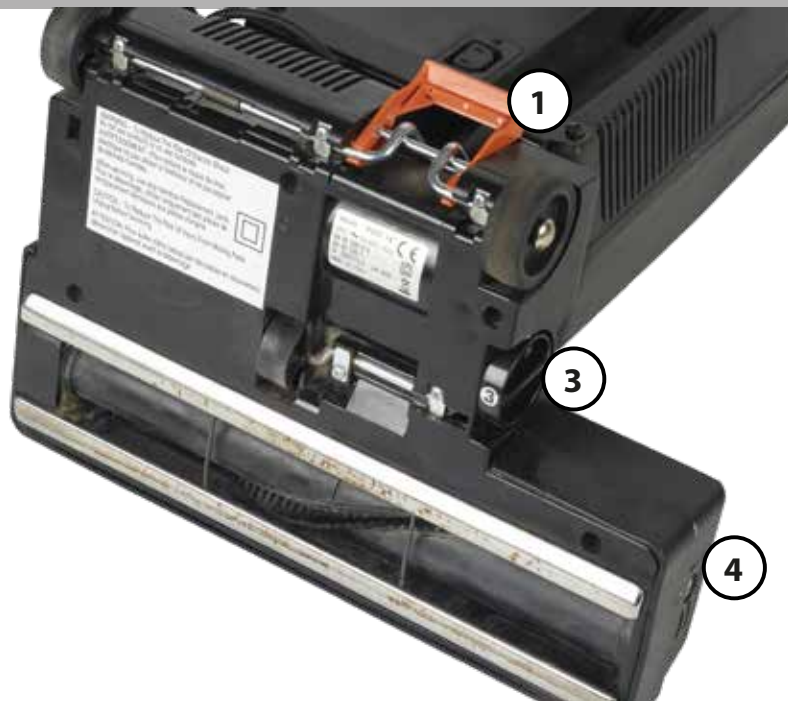

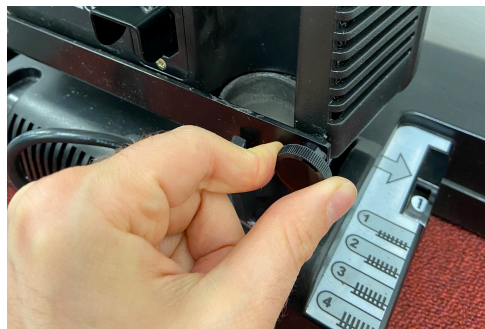

Assembling the vacuum cleaner

**The UCS requires some basic assembly before use (no tools are required).

Attach the power head

Line up the exhauster unit with the power head. Use the 2 thumbscrews to attach the power head to the exhauster unit.



Attach the power cable

Push the powerhead lead into the socket on the exhauster unit. This will provide power to the brush roller.



Attach the cable restraint

The cable restraint takes the strain of the cable if pulled. To attach, loop the cable restraint onto the thumbscrew. This thumbscrew will also hold the handle in place.



Attach the handle

Place the handle into the designated hole on the exhauster unit. Once in place, use the thumbscrew to attach the cable restraint and hold the handle in place.



Attach the suction hose

Push the black end of the suction hose into the connecting tube. To use the wand hose, remove the suction hose end and attach the crevice nozzle or dusting brush. For extended reach, attach the extender tubes to the hose before connecting the crevice nozzle or dusting brush.



Changing the paper bag

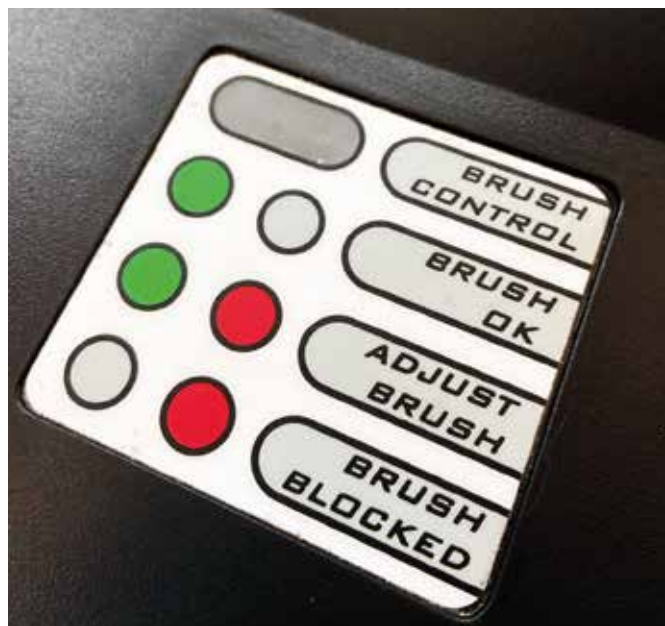
To change the dust bag: Remove front cover by pulling the catch forward and letting the door drop forward. Remove the existing bag by sliding it off the vacuum bag inlet. Check the filter is clean and free from dust (see below). Attach a new vacuum bag by pushing the opening over the vacuum bag inlet. Close the cover ensuring the catch clicks shut.



How to change the filter

Rotate the green filter cover until the fixing tabs are free from the holding lip. Remove the filter from the filter cover and replace. Rotate the green filter cover until the 2 tabs are snugly beneath the holding lip.

Motorised Brush Controls



The motorized brush control device constantly regulates the operation of the beater:

Green light:

The motorized brush is working correctly.

Red light:

The motorized brush is locked or it has been subjected to excessive stress. Lift the base with the adjustment device, then move the appliance to the upright position for a few seconds and resume working. If the red light persists, switch off the appliance, unplug it and check the causes of blockage.

Red/Green light:

The roller is not touching the floor. Adjust the height of the base using the dial P. It is possible that the roller is worn or the transmission belt is broken.

How to replace the roller or transmission belt



IMPORTANT NOTE: Before proceeding with this operation, switch off the appliance and unplug it. Use a coin or flathead screwdriver to loosen the screw fastening the cover completely Q. Use a tool (e.g. a pair of pliers), to remove the hair-covered, worn strip then replace it with another, following these steps in reverse order to fit it.

Important Information - READ BEFORE USE

WARNING:

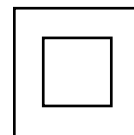
TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRIC SHOCK OR INJURY:

- Check the voltage rating of the appliance before connecting the power cord to an electrical outlet; your power source should correspond with the voltage rating plate located on the underside of your appliance.
- A damaged appliance can be dangerous; check the packaging, the vacuum cleaner and the accessories for any sign of damage. Do not use a damaged appliance.
- Do not leave the appliance plugged in. Unplug from the outlet when not in use and before servicing or cleaning.
- Your model is a dry unit, do not use outdoors, on wet surfaces or to vacuum any sort of liquid. Only dry surfaces should be vacuumed. Do not use this appliance to pick up liquids as this could impair the electrical safety of the appliance. This applies to freshly shampooed carpets: wait until they are dry.
- Do not allow the appliance to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when used by or near children.
- Use only as described in this manual. Use only manufacturer's recommended attachments.
- This appliance is provided with double insulation. Use only identical replacement parts. See instructions for Servicing of Double-Insulated Appliances.
- If the cable is damaged it should be replaced only by an authorised after sale service. Never use the appliance with a damaged cord or plug. Never use the cleaner with a damaged cord or plug.
- If the appliance is not working as it should, has been dropped, damaged, left outdoors or immersed in water bring the unit to a dealer or to an after sale centre.
- For any repair or for purchase of accessory parts contact only your private dealer or an authorised technical centre. Do not attempt any repairs.
- Do not pull or carry by the cord, use the cord as an handle, close a door on the cord, or pull the cord around sharp edges or corners. Do not run the appliance over the cord. Keep the cord away from heated surfaces.
- Do not unplug by pulling the cord. To unplug, grasp the plug, not the cord. Do not handle the plug or the appliance itself with wet hands.
- Appliance and wands must not be used at head level to avoid injury to eyes and ears.
- Always keep hair, clothing, jewellery, fingers and all parts of the body away from openings and moving parts.
- Always put the switch into the OFF position after use.
- Use extra care when cleaning on stairs.
- When using this appliance with an accessory always unplug before connecting any rotating brush. In any case never touch the rotating brush while in use.
- Do not run the appliance over the mains cable or any extension cable.
- Avoid picking up sharp objects.
- Always turn off the appliance before connecting or disconnecting the hose.
- The mains plug and the power socket must not come in contact with water. These items may only be cleaned with a dry cloth, no moisture must touch them. Danger of electric shock.
- Do not pick up anything that is burning or smoking, such as cigarettes, matches, or hot ashes.
- Never use to pick up flammable or combustible liquids, such as gasoline, or use in areas where fumes may be present.
- Do not put any objects into the openings. Never use with opening blocked, keep free of dust, lint, hair and anything that may reduce the airflow.
- Do not vacuum toner dust. Toner, such as that used in printers and photocopiers can conduct electricity.
- Turn off all controls before unplugging.

SERVICING OF DOUBLE-INSULATED APPLIANCES

A double-insulated appliance is marked with one or more of the following: The words:

“DOUBLE INSULATION” or “DOUBLE INSULATED” or the double insulation symbol (square within a square).



In a double-insulated appliance, two systems of insulation are provided instead of grounding. No grounding means is provided on a double-insulated appliance, nor should a means for grounding be added to the appliance. Servicing a double-insulated appliance requires extreme care and knowledge of the system, and should be done only by qualified service personnel.

Replacement parts for a double-insulated appliance must be identical to the parts they replace.

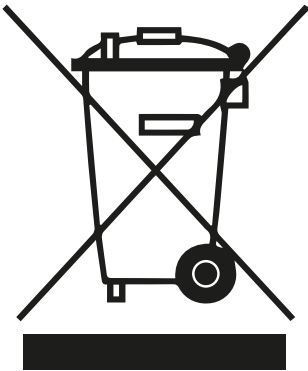
Important Information - WEEE Compliance

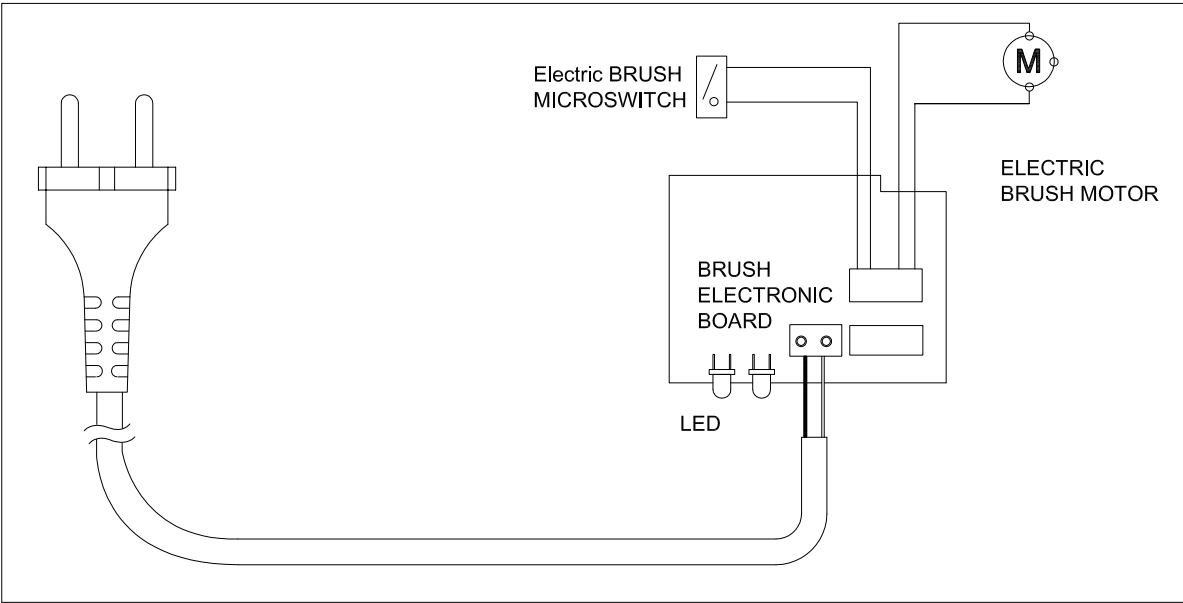

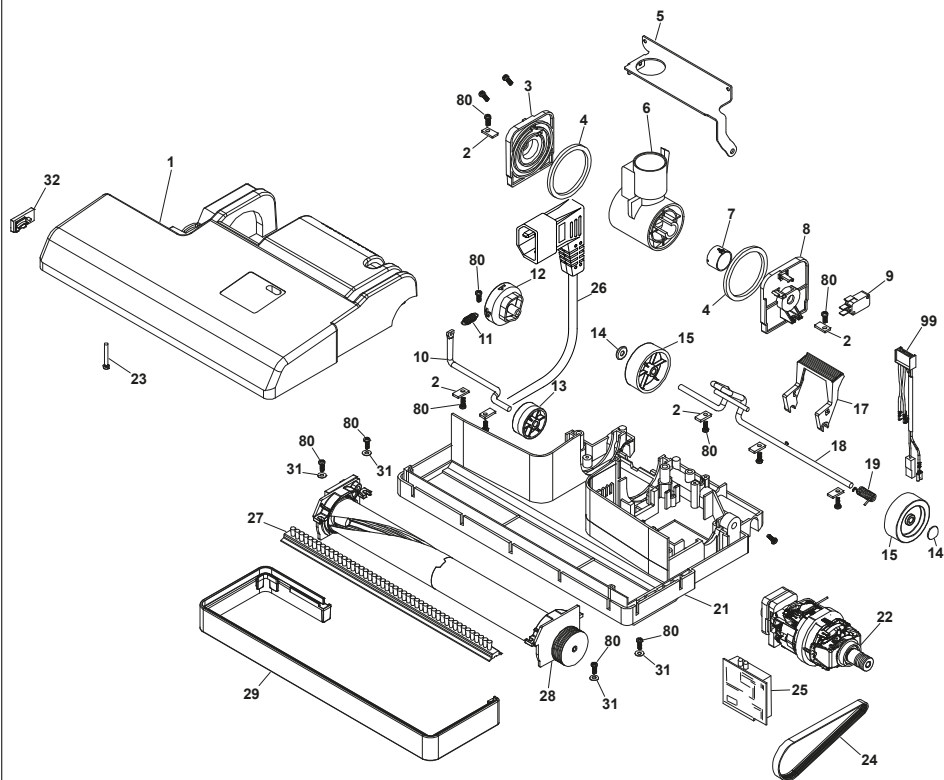
Schematic Datagram - Victor UCS

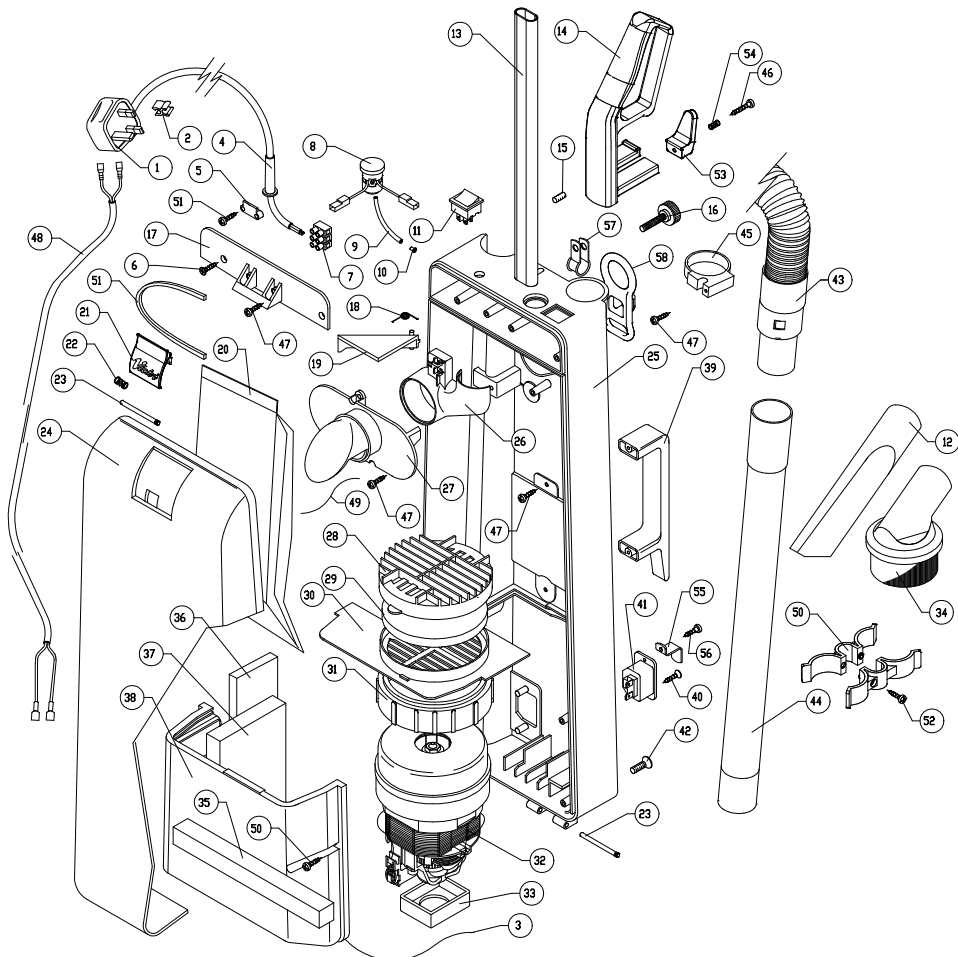
